TopText is a typesetting program running on Brolga. It is the "public" system to replace JUSTIF on the KL-10. More about this package in the next Bulletin—those attending should have a working knowledge of Unix and vi—courses in June and July.

Is your Artwork professional?

If you have answered "no", then The Prentice Centre's new Graphic Design Unit may be your solution.

The new Graphic Design Unit comprises a large section of self-help areas where staff and students can do their own artwork and poster production at a greatly reduced rate, under the supervision of Graphic Artist, Sue Gray.

For example, if you were making a poster in the self-help area, you could cut cardboard to the size you need, paste on your artwork (diagrams, graphs, pictures), then use the lettering machines for labels.

There are two types of lettering machines: Leteron and Kroy. They are both quite simple to use.

Leteron makes self-adhesive coloured letters up to 3 cm in height. Use Leteron for major headings on your poster.

Kroy produces black letters up to 1 cm in height on a clear adhesive tape. Kroy lettering is ideal for labelling diagrams.

The new Graphic Design Unit is located on Level 2 (Ground floor) of the Prentice Building, opposite the Lecture Theatre at the west end of the building.

You can use these facilities for \$15 per hour plus materials. Payment can only be made using an Interdepartmental requisition form.

Prentice offers Mac Classes



With the growing popularity of Macintosh computers on campus, The Prentice Centre will be offering Mac classes. Two types of classes will be presented in Semester 2:

Introduction to Macintosh

This three half-day class provides for a basic understanding of the Mac. New users will become familiar with the mouse, menus, icons, windows, folders and desk accessories. As with all introductory classes, participants need no previous experience in using the Mac.

Introduction to Word (Mac)

Participants who understand the basics of the Mac will learn wordprocessing using the popular package, *Microsoft Word* in this four half-day class. No wordprocessing knowledge is necessary, but an understanding of the Mac computer is assumed.

Classes will be held in the PC Lab on Level 2 (Ground Floor) of the Prentice Building.

Shareware Updated in PC Lab

Shareware is legal, low-cost software that you can copy and use on your computer. You may even give copies to your friends! However, it is not free software. After an evaluation period, you and your friends are required to delete the software or register your copy with the author.

The Prentice Centre has now received new Shareware ready for you to evaluate—the 9th edition of the PC-SIG Library on CD ROM.

The CD ROM contains over 6000 software programs, ranging from wordprocessors, databases and graphics programs to Windows applications.

Even if you already have Shareware software, the new 9th edition comes with 400 new programs and 586 updates to existing programs. So come along to the PC Lab for the latest Shareware releases!

To have your own copy of Shareware programs, come to the PC lab, copy the programs that you want, and send payment to the author (details given with the shareware). The CD ROM is easy-to-use for extracting the programs you want. All you need is your own double density floppy disk (you cannot use high density disks), or you can purchase disks from the PC Lab.

The cost is \$2.00 per hour for the time you spend in the PC Lab plus 2.00 per software product you copy. The PC Lab is on Level 2 (ground floor) of the Prentice Building. Telephone $365\ 4114$ for enquiries.

Requests will either be filled from stock or when they become available within a few days.
