INTERROGATING TYPEWRITER 1938



DESCRIPTION

The 1938 Interrogating Typewriter is an on-line input/output device for the 1900 series. The Typewriter allows messages to be entered into an operational program via a keyboard, and at the same time to be printed on a continuous paper form. The 1938 also types out messages from the program.

A single Interrogating Typewriter may be connected directly to a Standard Interface Channel in the Processor, or a number may be connected via a 1992 Communications Multiplexor.

- Keyboard communication with operational programs
- Printed record of all messages
- Automatic code conversion between keyboard and processor
- Printing speed ten characters a second
